## CDC's Winnable Battles

## W3TFL Contact Information

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has begun an effort to achieve measurable impact quickly in a few targeted areas. These targeted areas address the leading causes of death and disability, as well as emerging public health challenges. The term "Winnable Battles" describes public health priorities with large-scale impact on health and with known, effective strategies to intervene. The charge under Winnable Battles is to identify optimal strategies and to rally resources and partnerships to accelerate a measurable impact on health. These priority areas include:

- Food Safety
- Global Immunization
- Healthcare-associated Infections
- HIV
- Lymphatic Filariasis in the Americas
- Mother-to-Child Transmission of HIV and Congenital Syphilis
- Motor Vehicle Injuries
- Nutrition, Physical Activity, and Obesity
- Teen Pregnancy
- Tobacco

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Tobacco use is a major preventable cause of premature death and disease worldwide. Approximately 6 million deaths related to tobacco use occur each year, including 600,000 from secondhand smoke. In the United States, an estimated 45.3 million people - about one in five adults - currently smoke, and an estimated 443,000 people die prematurely from diseases caused by smoking or secondhand smoke exposure.

CDC has identified reducing tobacco use as a Winnable Battle. With additional effort and support for evidence-based, cost-effective strategies that we can implement now, we will have a significant impact on our nation's health. The goal for tobacco is to: Prevent the initiation of tobacco use, promote quitting and ensure smoke-free environments. The indicators to be used for measuring progress towards the goal are:

	Baseline	2015 Goal
Decrease the percent of adults who smoke cigarettes	20.6% (2008)	17% (17.5% reduction)
Decrease the percent of youth who smoke cigarettes	20% (2007)	17.6% (12% reduction)
Increase the proportion of the U.S. population covered by smoke-free laws	36.7% (2008)	58.5% (59% increase)
